Vortex: Vortex is one of the hottest modern hunting brands. Diamondback, Viper, and Razor models all move quickly and command strong resale value. Great brand for consistent flips.

Canon: Canon's Image Stabilized binoculars are a sleeper hit. Many models sell between \$500 and \$1,150. They're unique, in demand, and often overlooked by casual sellers.

Zeiss / Carl Zeiss Jena: Both modern Zeiss and vintage Jena models sell extremely well. Expect \$150-\$350 for most vintage units, with premium models going much higher. Collectors love this brand.

Leupold: Leupold binoculars are popular with hunters and outdoorsmen. Most models fall in the

\$120-\$250 range and sell consistently. A great mid-range brand to target.

Pentax / Asahi Pentax: Vintage Pentax binoculars - especially Japanese-made units - are reliable sellers in the \$100-\$150 range. Solid flips with predictable demand.
